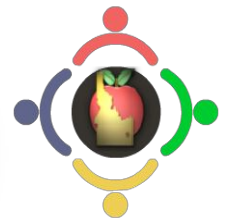
**12c. Board Calendar**

## Tips for Speeding Up Slow iPads

### 1. Update to the Latest iOS.

Make sure you have the most current version available for your device. Just go to Settings > General > Software Update.

### 2. Delete Unneeded Apps

If your iPad is running slowly, it could be because it's memory is getting full. You should only have 5-10 apps on each iPad. Anything more than that is an overload.

### 3. Clear Browser Cache

Whenever you visit a webpage, the browser will automatically save its content in its memory cache. Over time, this can slow down your browsing experience.

### 4. Purge Apps From Memory

Our iPads multitask by suspending apps that are no longer active but still allow a portion of the app to keep running in the background. The iPad could have too many apps running in the background. To close the application, double-click the home button and swipe the apps off the top of the screen.

### 5. Reboot the iPad

Rebooting the iPad will flush everything from the memory and give it a clean start. To do this, hold down the sleep/wake button. It will prompt you to slide a button to power off the iPad. Boot it back up by holding down the sleep/wake button again. You will see the Apple logo, and the iPad will boot up shortly.

### 6. Check Your Wifi Connection

All iPads within the district should be connected to SD25-WifiD. You want your iPad to "forget" all other networks. This will prevent the iPad from attempting to bounce from one wifi connection to the next.



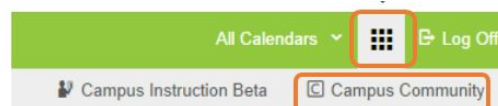

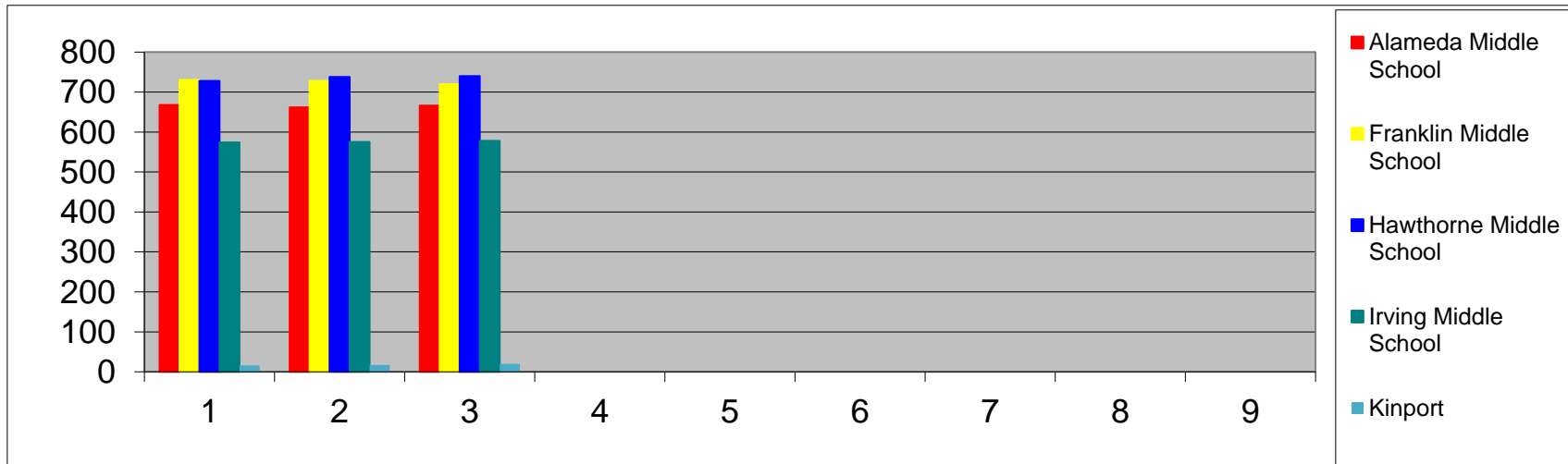
