Call to Order/Executive Session – Student Discipline:

Chair Gebhardt called the meeting to order at 4:34 p.m. A motion was made by Ms. Cranor and seconded by Mr. Facer to adjourn to Executive Session. The roll call vote was unanimous in the affirmative: Mr. Vitale, aye; Mr. Facer, aye; Ms. Cranor, aye; Ms. Gebhardt, aye. The Board adjourned to Executive Session at 4:35 p.m.

Purpose: To discuss student discipline.

The Board proceeded to discuss student discipline as provided in Idaho Code, Section 67-2345 (1) (b) *to consider the evaluation, dismissal or disciplining of, or to hear complaints or charges brought against a public school student;*

Return to Open Session:

The Board returned to Open Session at 5:10 p.m. A motion was made by Mr. Vitale and seconded by Mr. Facer that the Board expel **Student Docket No. 13-30** from attendance at the Pocatello/Chubbuck School District No. 25 for the remainder of the 2012-2013 school year.

Such motion is based upon the judgment of the Board of Trustees that **Student Docket No. 13-30** has:

1. Engaged in conduct in violation of the District's Student Discipline Policy relating to the possession of a deadly or dangerous weapon on school property.
2. Engaged in conduct, which in the judgment of the Board, is detrimental to the health, welfare and safety of other pupils.

However, pursuant to the statutory discretion provided to the Board relating to the discipline of students and with consideration of the input of the District's administration, this expulsion shall be held in abeyance and not put into place contingent upon **Student Docket No. 13-30** meeting the following conditions:

1. The student shall return to educational activities at Franklin Middle School.
 - a. The student shall attend and actively participate in Lunch Academy until such time as the grades for all classes are at a grade of "C" or better.

- b. Should the student's grades in any class slip below a "C" any time thereafter, at the sole discretion of the school's administration, the student shall return to attendance and participation in the Lunch Academy or other Credit Recovery program.
 - c. The Board would also encourage the student to participate in extra-curricular activities when the student is eligible.
2. Attendance shall be pursuant to a strict academic and behavioral contract. This contract shall be in effect through the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year. The student and family of the student shall meet with the school's administration for the preparation of the contract. However, the final terms of this contract are at the sole discretion of the school's administration. The terms of the contract shall include at minimum the following:
 - a. Attendance expectations.
 - b. Grade expectations.
 - c. A provision that the property of the student and the locker of the student shall be subject to random searches. The Board likewise requests that the family engage in random searches of the student prior to the student coming to school.
 - d. The student shall participate in fifteen (15) hours of community service, separate and apart from any court-ordered service, with written confirmation of such community service being provided to the school's administration. The community service can be school-related community service under the direction of the school's administration.
 3. Should the student be provided any social services or health care services or be under the purview of the juvenile probation department, documentation will be entered into which permits a free flow of information between these individuals or providers and the school, only with regard to matters which impact upon her education.

Should the student engage in any other infraction of District or School Discipline Policies, or fail to fulfill the reasonable terms and conditions established by the Board for continued enrollment, the student shall be brought back before the Board of Trustees for consideration of implementation of the expulsion held in abeyance. The voting was unanimous in the affirmative. The Board recessed at 5:15 p.m.

Return to Executive Session – Student Discipline:

Following the recess, a motion was made by Ms. Cranor and seconded by Mr. Vitale to reconvene to Executive Session at 5:17 p.m. The roll call vote was unanimous in the affirmative: Mr. Vitale, aye; Mr. Facer, aye; Ms. Cranor, aye; Ms. Gebhardt, aye.

Return to Open Session:

The student shall participate in fifteen (15) hours of in-school community service, separate and apart from any court-ordered service, with written confirmation of such community service being provided to the school's administration. The in-school community service shall be conducted under the direction of the school's administration and prior to the end of the current school year.

Should the student engage in any other infraction of District or School Discipline Policies, or fail to fulfill the reasonable terms and conditions established by the Board for continued enrollment, the student shall be brought back before the Board of Trustees for consideration of implementation of the expulsion held in abeyance. The voting was unanimous in the affirmative.

A motion was made by Ms. Cranor and seconded by Mr. Facer to adjourn. The voting was unanimous in the affirmative. The Board adjourned at 6:08 p.m.
